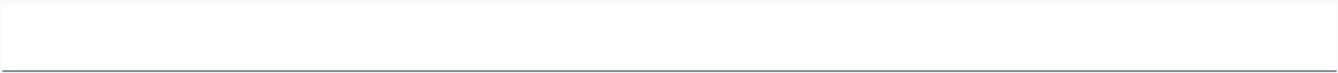
While the bounce house is the main event, having additional activities prevents boredom and gives kids variety.
