The Neck Stretch

Stand or sit with good posture. Gently tilt your head to one side, bringing your ear toward your shoulder. Hold for 15-30 seconds. Repeat on the other side. This helps relieve tension and improve muscle definition in the neck and jaw area.

Makeup and Styling Hacks for an Immediate Effect
