Where to Find TV Guide Listings Phoenix AZ

Traditional Printed Guides

While digital is the norm, some Phoenix residents still prefer a physical newspaper. The Arizona Republic includes a weekly TV guide supplement that lists prime-time programming for major networks like ABC, CBS, NBC, FOX, and PBS. These printed listings can be handy for quick reference and don’t require an internet connection. However, they are often printed days in advance and may not reflect last-minute schedule changes due to sports overruns or breaking news.

Online TV Listings Websites

Several dedicated websites offer current and custom TV guide listings Phoenix AZ. These digital guides allow you to filter by channel, time slot, genre, or even specific shows. Popular options include:

- **TitanTV** – Offers a detailed grid view for Phoenix channels, including COX, CenturyLink, and DirecTV lineups.
- **Zap2it** – A long-standing favorite that provides local listings with the ability to search for programs.
- **TV Guide** – The official site allows you to set your location to Phoenix and view schedules for both broadcast and cable.
- **LocateTV** – Great for cord-cutters, as it shows what’s available over-the-air (OTA) and on streaming platforms.

These platforms are updated in real time, so if a game runs into overtime, you’ll see the adjusted schedule. Many also offer email or app alerts for your favorite shows.

Mobile Apps for On-the-Go Viewing

Phoenix is a sprawling city, and you may want to check listings while commuting on the I-10 or waiting for a flight at Sky Harbor. Mobile apps from TV Guide, Yahoo TV, or your specific cable provider (e.g., Cox Contour app) put the schedule right in your pocket. These apps often integrate with your DVR or streaming service, allowing you to record or start a program with a single tap. For the most seamless experience, download an app that syncs with your home TV provider and uses your location to deliver TV guide listings Phoenix AZ automatically.

Understanding Channel Lineups in Phoenix

Major Broadcast Networks

Phoenix’s local affiliates deliver national network programming along with local news and sports. The key stations include:

- **KPNX (NBC) – Channel 12** – Known for its morning news and “12 News” broadcasts.
- **KNXV (ABC) – Channel 15** – Offers ABC prime time plus “ABC15 News.”
- **KSAZ (FOX) – Channel 10** – Home to FOX primetime and “FOX 10 News.”
- **KPHO (CBS) – Channel 5** – Delivers CBS shows and “CBS 5 News.”
- **KAET (PBS) – Channel 8** – Arizona PBS provides educational programming, British dramas, and local documentaries.
- **KTVK (Independent) – Channel 3** – “3TV” offers local news and syndicated entertainment.

When consulting TV guide listings Phoenix AZ, be aware that over-the-air (OTA) channels differ from cable channel numbers. For example, KPNX is OTA channel 12, but on Cox it may appear as channel 12 or 1012 depending on the package.

Cable and Satellite Providers

The most common providers in the Phoenix area are:

- **Cox Communications** – The dominant cable operator with packages ranging from Contour TV to basic digital.
- **DirecTV** – Satellite service popular in areas where cable infrastructure is limited.

- **DISH Network** – Another satellite option with extensive channel lineups.
- **CenturyLink Prism TV** – Fiber-optic TV available in select neighborhoods.

Each provider has its own channel numbering scheme. To avoid confusion, use the provider-specific guide or a third-party site that lets you select “Cox Phoenix” as your lineup. The most reliable TV guide listings Phoenix AZ will always ask you to confirm your provider to display the correct channel numbers.

Local Programming You Should Know

Phoenix Suns Basketball Coverage

The Suns are a major draw for Phoenix sports fans. Games are broadcast on Bally Sports Arizona (now part of the Diamond Sports Group). On Cox, that’s typically channel 34 (SD) and 1034 (HD). Check your guide for “Phoenix Suns Basketball” or use the keyword search feature. During NBA season, game times often vary, making real-time TV guide listings Phoenix AZ indispensable.

Arizona Cardinals Football

NFL games are split between CBS, FOX, and NBC for Sunday and Monday nights. The Arizona Cardinals’ regular-season games are usually on FOX (KSAZ) or CBS (KPHO) depending on the opponent. For afternoon kickoff’s, local listings will show the game as “NFL Football” or specifically “Arizona Cardinals vs. [opponent].”

Local News and Weather

Phoenix is known for its extreme heat and monsoon storms. Local news channels produce multiple newscasts each day, with KPNX’s “12 News” and KNXV’s “ABC15 News” being the most watched. Weather coverage is especially critical during monsoon season (June–September), so many viewers tune in to The Weather Channel (Cox 32) or use the local affiliate’s live stream. TV guide listings Phoenix AZ will note special weather specials or extended coverage when monsoon warnings are active.

Arizona PBS

KAET (Channel 8) offers a wealth of local content, including “Arizona Horizon,” “Desert Speaks,” and “State of the State” address coverage. It’s also a great source for children’s programming during the day and British favorites like “Doctor Who” and “Call the Midwife” in the evenings. Because PBS schedules may differ from commercial networks, always double-check the latest TV guide listings Phoenix AZ to catch pledge drives or special episodes.

Streaming and Cord-Cutting in Phoenix

Over-the-Air (OTA) Antenna Options

Many Phoenix households are switching to antennas to access major networks for free. A good outdoor or attic antenna can pull in KPNX, KNXV, KSAZ, KPHO, KAET, and several subchannels. Once you have an antenna, you still need a way to see what’s airing. Websites like AntennaWeb or RabbitEars will show you which channels you can receive at your specific address. Then, a digital TV guide like “TV Guide Listings Phoenix AZ OTA” on Zap2it or TitanTV will let you set up a custom grid with only those channels. A DVR like Tablo or AirTV can also integrate OTA channels with streaming guide data.

Live TV Streaming Services

Services like YouTube TV, Hulu + Live TV, Sling TV, and DirecTV Stream all offer access to local networks in Phoenix. Each has its own channel lineup and pricing. When comparing, look at whether they include your must-have channels (e.g., Bally Sports Arizona for Suns games, or local news). Most of these services provide a built-in guide that mirrors traditional TV guide listings Phoenix AZ but with the ability to pause, rewind, and record unlimited content in the cloud.

- **YouTube TV** – Offers most major network affiliates in Phoenix, plus Bally Sports Arizona (as of 2025, check availability). Unlimited DVR storage.
- **Hulu + Live TV** – Includes ABC (KNXV), NBC (KPNX), FOX (KSAZ), and CBS (KPHO). DVR is limited with the base plan.
- **Sling TV** – Does not always carry all local affiliates; you may need an antenna for news and network prime time. However, it offers a low-cost way to get cable channels like ESPN, TNT, and AMC.
- **DirecTV Stream** – The most comprehensive option with nearly every local and regional sports channel, but at a higher monthly cost.

Whichever service you choose, the interface includes a searchable TV guide listings Phoenix AZ. You can set favorites, hide channels, and even see upcoming episodes of shows you’ve added to your library.

How to Stay Updated on Schedule Changes

Sports Overruns and Delays

Phoenix is a sports town, and live events often cause schedule shifts. If a Suns game goes to overtime, the following Fox show might start 30 minutes late. The best TV guide listings Phoenix AZ will note “live” or “scheduled” and then update automatically. For example, if you rely on a physical newspaper, you might miss the adjustment. Digital guides and apps are far more reliable for real-time accuracy.

Breaking News and Emergency Alerts

During a major storm or incident, local stations preempt scheduled programs for extended news coverage. The TV guide on your screen may show “Local News Special” or “Weather Coverage.” For the most accurate information, combine your digital guide with the station’s social media account or website. Some guide apps allow you to set notifications for changes to your favorite shows.

Season Finales and Premieres

Networks often announce premiere dates months in advance. To avoid missing the season opener of your favorite show, subscribe to a reminder service within your TV guide listings Phoenix AZ app. Many allow you to toggle “Remind Me” and will send push notifications to your phone.

Tips for Using TV Guide Listings Efficiently

1. **Customize Your Grid** – Most online guides let you hide channels you never watch. Remove shopping channels, foreign language, or religious networks to simplify the view.
2. **Use Search Filters** – Looking only for movies? Sports? Filter by genre. For instance, if you want to find all NFL games airing in Phoenix on Sunday, search “NFL” in your guide.
3. **Bookmark or Favorites** – Save channels like KSAZ, KPNX, and Bally Sports Arizona as favorites so they appear at the top of your guide.
4. **Check Multiple Providers** – If you have Cox but want to see what’s on OTA, use a separate guide. The same channel number may refer to different stations on different
