Spring Events in Xtardew Valley

The Egg Festival (Spring 13)

The Egg Festival is one of the most beloved events in Xtardew Valley, and it marks the first major festival of the year. Taking place on Spring 13 in the town square, this event is centered around a single-mini game: the Egg Hunt. At 9 AM, you will arrive at the square, where villagers are gathered around tables decorated with colorful eggs. Mayor Lewis will announce the start of the hunt, and you will have 50 seconds to collect as many eggs as possible from around Pelican Town. The key to winning is knowing the egg spawn locations—eggs can be found behind bushes, near fences, and even behind the community center. Practice makes perfect, but as a general rule, head toward the river first, as many eggs spawn near the water.

Rewards for the Egg Festival include a Straw Hat (if you win the egg hunt) and a chance to purchase seasonal items from Pierre's booth, such as the Strawberry Seeds. Strawberries are one of the most profitable spring crops, so it is wise to spend any spare gold on these seeds. Additionally, talking to villagers during the festival increases friendship points, so make sure to interact with everyone present. Note that Pierre's shop is closed on this day, but his festival booth offers unique items you cannot buy elsewhere.

The Flower Dance (Spring 24)

The Flower Dance takes place on Spring 24 in the forest clearing just south of town, near the lake. This event is unique because it combines a social gathering with a subtle relationship test. At the Flower Dance, villagers pair up to dance, and you can ask one of the eligible bachelors or bachelorettes to be your dance partner. However, you will need at least four hearts of friendship with that character for them to accept your invitation. If they agree, you will share a special dance sequence, and cuteness ensues. If they decline, do not worry—there is always next year, and you can spend the event enjoying the decorations and talking to other villagers.

The Flower Dance does not offer material rewards like gold or items, but the friendship boost from dancing with a partner is substantial. Additionally, simply attending the event and speaking to every villager present will raise your overall friendship levels across the board. This event is also a fantastic opportunity to forage for spring wildflowers, as the forest area is rich in edible plants. Make sure to arrive early to explore the area before the dance begins at 9 AM.

Summer Events in Xtardew Valley

The Luau (Summer 11)

The Luau is a community potluck held on the beach on Summer 11. This event is all about the soup—specifically, the communal

soup that everyone contributes to. Before the Luau, you will need to bring an ingredient to add to the pot. The quality of your ingredient determines the Governor's reaction, which in turn affects your friendship points with all villagers. For the best outcome, bring a high-quality item such as a gold star or iridium star crop, a rare fish, or a foraged item with high value. Avoid bringing low-quality items like sap or common mushrooms, as these will result in a negative reaction and lost friendship.

The Luau rewards include a significant friendship boost with every villager if the soup is a success. Additionally, the event is a great place to socialize, as all villagers are present on the beach. After the soup tasting, you are free to explore the beach and fish or forage for items that are unique to this event. Note that Willy's fish shop will be closed, but you can still fish in the ocean using your own rod. The Dance of the Moonlight Jellies (Summer 28)

The final day of summer brings the Dance of the Moonlight Jellies, a serene and beautiful event held at the beach after dark. This event does not require any items or mini-games. Simply arrive at the beach between 7 PM and midnight, and you will watch the moonlight jellies swim by in a spectacular light show. It is a peaceful event that focuses on atmosphere and storytelling. Spirit's Eve (Fall 27)

Spirit's Eve, often compared to Halloween, is a spooky festival held on Fall 27 in the town square. The main attraction is a maze that changes layout each year. The Golden Pumpkin can be given to any character for a massive friendship boost, or you can sell it for a high price. During Spirit's Eve, villagers wear costumes, and the town is decorated with jack-o-lanterns and eerie lighting. You can talk to villagers for unique dialogue and small friendship gains. Unlike the Fair, there are no mini-games or booths to spend tokens. The event is relatively simple, but the Golden Pumpkin reward makes it a must-attend.
