Justin’s attempts to keep her from discovering the truth become increasingly desperate. He eventually has to use his magic to protect her and cover up her lack of powers. The episode culminates in a confrontation where Gigi is finally revealed as a non-wizard, but the resolution is handled with surprising warmth. Rather than being embarrassed or angry, Gigi takes the news in stride, showing her resilient and forgiving nature. She even encourages Justin to embrace his own wizard identity without guilt. This episode solidifies her as a character who brings out a softer, more protective side of Justin.

Later Appearances in Season 2 and Beyond

Following the WizTech storyline, Gigi appears in a couple of other episodes, though her roles are significantly smaller. In “The Supernatural,” she has a brief cameo at a party, and in “Third Wheel,” she is part of a group of Justin’s friends. Her final notable appearance is in “Future Justin,” where she interacts with a version of Justin from the future. viewers with her irrepressible charm.
