- **Episodes 95-100: The Journey to Demon World** – Yusuke and his team enter the demon world to find Raizen, Yusuke's ancestor. The tone shifts to exploration and world-building.
- **Episodes 101-108: The Tournament to Determine the Next Ruler** – A multi-round demon world tournament is proposed as an alternative to all-out war.
