- **Scootaloo** — An orange pegasus who idolizes Rainbow Dash.
- **Sweetie Belle** — A white unicorn with a pink mane, Rarity’s sister.

Other Notable Characters

The G4 cast is enormous. Some fan-favorites include **Discord** (the spirit of chaos), **Spike** (the dragon), **Starlight Glimmer**, **Sunset Shimmer**, **Trixie Lulamoon**, **Maude Pie**, **Big McIntosh**, **Derpy Hooves** (a background pony with a huge following), and **Vinyl Scratch** (also known as DJ Pon-3). The show introduced many background ponies that became beloved, such as **Octavia Melody**, **Lyra Heartstrings**, **Bon Bon**, and **Doctor Whooves**.
