If they win the round while using this, they score two points. If they lose, they are disqualified from the match for "giving in to their anger."

Match Structure and Tournament Play

For serious competitions, a best-of-three or best-of-five format is common. Players can also adopt a point system: one point for a standard pin, two points for a pin executed while your opponent is attempting a special move, and a "disarming" victory if you can bend your opponent's thumb back enough to break the lock (done very gently, of course). The first player to reach five or seven points wins the match.

Equipment and Customization: Building Your Lightsaber

Crafting Your Thumb Saber

- **Paper Tubes:** A toilet paper roll or a strip of cardstock taped into a tube is the easiest starting point. You can then decorate it with markers, paint, or foil.
- **Modeling Clay:** For a more durable, sculpted hilt, use oven-bake clay to create a custom grip and emitter shroud. Paint it with metallic acrylics.

Yellow is for the Jedi Temple Guards, and white or black are for unique, rare characters like Ahsoka Tano or the Darksaber wielder.

Strategies and Advanced Techniques
