- **Save before the encounter.** This is the most important step. Enter the grass where Haxorus appears and save your game immediately. If you accidentally knock it out or run out of Poke Balls, you can reset and try again.
- **Use a Pokemon with a status move.** Putting Haxorus to sleep or paralyzing it dramatically increases your catch rate. A Pokemon like Breloom with Spore or a fast Pokemon with Thunder Wave is ideal.
- **Bring plenty of Ultra Balls.** These have the highest catch rate of standard Poke Balls. Timer Balls can also be effective if the battle drags on. For the best odds, consider using a Dusk Ball if you are catching it at night or inside a cave, but since the preserve is outdoors, Ultra Balls are generally the best choice.
- **Weaken it carefully.** Use moves that lower its HP without knocking it out. False Swipe is the perfect move for this, as it leaves the target with at least 1 HP. If you do not have a Pokemon with False Swipe, use a weak move and watch the HP bar closely.
- **Be patient.** Even with optimal conditions, catching a legendary or rare Pokemon can take several attempts. Do not rush the process.

The Shiny Haxorus is a powerful Dragon-type Pokemon with excellent stats and a fantastic movepool. It is well worth the effort to catch it, and it will serve as a standout member of any team.

Complete List of Wild Pokemon in the Nature Preserve

Beyond the Shiny Haxorus, the **Nature Preserve Pokemon White 2** is home to a variety of species that appear exclusively in the Hidden Grottoes. The exact Pokemon you encounter depend on the grotto and the RNG (random number generator) of the game. Some of the notable species include:

- **Eevee:** A fan-favorite Pokemon that can evolve into eight different forms. Finding Eevee here is a great way to obtain one if you missed the earlier gift in Castelia City.
