Learn basic combos and practice blocking enemy attacks. Exploration is rewarded in these stages, as hidden paths often contain collectibles that are crucial for progression. Treat these levels as a deliberate, tactical break from the daytime chaos.

Continental Walkthrough: A Region-by-Region Guide

The world in **Sonic Unleashed** is divided into several continents, each with its own hub town, set of stages, and boss fights. This section of our **Sonic Unleashed walkthrough** will take you through each region in the optimal order.

1. Apotos: The Sunlit Shores

Your journey begins in the picturesque town of Apotos, inspired by the Greek islands. This serves as the tutorial area, easing you into both gameplay styles. The daytime stage, Windmill Isle, is straightforward and a great place to practice boosting and drifting. The nighttime stage, Savannah Citadel, introduces Werehog combat with simple enemies and basic platforming puzzles. **Collect all the Sun and Moon Medals** you can find here—they are essential for unlocking later stages and upgrades. The boss of this area, the Egg Beetle, is a simple aerial fight. Homing attack its weak point when it opens, and dodge its homing missiles by sidestepping.

2. Spagonia: The Academic City

Spagonia introduces more complex stage design. The daytime stage, Rooftop Run, is a fan-favorite for its flow and verticality. **Use the light dash function** to follow ring trails and maintain your speed. The nighttime stage, Arid Sands, features wider combat arenas and more aggressive enemies. In the hub world, talk to the professor to unlock new abilities and side quests. The boss here, the Egg Devil Ray, requires you to hit it while it swoops down. Time your homing attacks carefully and avoid its laser grid.
