4. The Park Jogger

Sporting athletic wear, headphones, and a water bottle, this minifigure represents the health-conscious side of urban living. The legs are printed with running shoe details, and the torso features a

moisture-wicking fabric pattern.

5. The Food Truck Chef

With a white chef's coat and a tall hat, this figure holds a spatula and a miniature taco. A separate food truck accessory (sold separately in some sets) can be combined with this minifigure to create a mobile dining experience.

6. The City Bicyclist

Riding a new bicycle frame (not a standard Lego bike, but a sleeker model), this character wears a helmet and a messenger bag. The legs have clips to attach to the pedals, making it one of the most dynamic figures in the series.

7. The Street Musician

This minifigure features a guitar case at its feet and a microphone stand. The torso has a print of a worn leather jacket, and the hands are positioned to hold a guitar. The musician's face includes a happy, singing expression.

8. The Office Worker

Carrying a stack of papers and a coffee mug, this figure is the embodiment of corporate life. The glasses, tie, and slightly disheveled hair tell a story of a busy day at work. The papers have printed graphs and charts.

9. The Dog Walker

One of the cutest figures: a person in casual clothes holding a leash attached to a new dog mold—a small terrier. The dog has a collar and a wagging tail piece. This pair instantly adds life to any sidewalk scene.

10. The Tourist

Dressed in a brightly colored Hawaiian shirt and a floppy hat, this character holds a camera and a map. The map is printed with a fictional city grid. The tourist's expression is one of wide-eyed wonder.

16. The Night Guard

The final figure in the series. Dressed in a security uniform with a flashlight and a walkie-talkie. The face has a serious expression. This figure works well for nighttime city scenes or museum displays.

How to Collect and Trade Lego Minifigures Series 12ity

As with all blind-bag series, collecting the complete Lego Minifigures Series 12ity can be a challenge. Here are some tips for building your set efficiently:

- **Feel the bags:** Each blind bag contains three parts: the figure, its accessories, and a baseplate. In Series 12ity, the unique accessories like the guitar case or the dog leash can help you identify the figure by feel. For example, the Coffee Cart Vendor's coffee cart piece is large and easy to distinguish.
- **Check the QR codes:** Many collectors use the small code printed on the bag's seal. Online databases (available on fan sites) can tell you which figure corresponds to which code. However, codes may vary by region, so verify with local communities.
- **Trade with friends or online groups:** Instead of buying multiple duplicates, join a Lego minifigure trading group on social media. You can swap the extra figures you get for ones you are missing. Series 12ity has a few rare figures (like the Night Guard) that are often in high demand.
- **Consider buying a full set:** After the initial release, some retailers and online marketplaces offer a complete sealed set of all 16 figures. This is more expensive but guarantees you get every character without repeats.
