Adelaide Crows (South Australia)

Established in 1990, the Adelaide Crows were one of the first expansion clubs outside Victoria. They quickly found success, winning back-to-back premierships in 1997 and 1998. Known for their passionate fan base at the Adelaide Oval, the Crows wear navy blue and gold. Their identity is deeply tied to the spirit of

Brisbane Lions (Queensland)
