He retired officially after season 31 in November 2022, citing a desire to spend more time with his family in England. His final episode was an emotional farewell, with past champions and judges returning to honor him. Goodman left on his own terms, a rare achievement in the entertainment industry. His final words to the audience were characteristically heartfelt: "Keep dancing."

Balancing Strictness with Kindness

Goodman would often roll his eyes at Bruno's effusive praise, only to later offer a more measured but still positive score.
