

How To Gift Games On Steam

Once the recipient accepts the gift, the game is added to their library. They can choose to decline it as well, in which case the game is returned to your

inventory for future gifting or refund.

Important Things to Remember

- **Regional restrictions:** If you and the recipient are in different countries, the game may not be giftable due to pricing or licensing differences. Steam displays a warning before checkout.
- **Friend for at least three days:** To prevent fraud, Steam requires you to have been friends with the recipient for at least three days before you can send them a direct gift. If you are not yet friends, consider adding them early or using an alternative method like a gift card.

- **Gift sent via email:** If you choose to send via email, the recipient must redeem the gift within 30 days. After that, the gift expires and you get a refund.

Method 2: Sending a Steam Digital Gift Card

Sometimes you aren't sure which game the person wants, or you want to give them the freedom to choose themselves. In that case, the best answer to **how to gift games on Steam** is a Steam Gift Card. These digital cards function just like cash in the Steam Wallet.

How to Purchase and Send a Gift Card

1. Open the Steam client or website and go to the **"Steam Gift Cards"** category. You can find it under the "Cards" menu at the top of the page.
2. Choose between a digital gift card sent via email or one that you can print at home. For instant delivery, the email option is best.
3. Select the amount you wish to gift. You can choose from preset values (e.g., \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100) or enter a custom amount.
4. Enter the recipient's email address. You can also add a personal message to make the gift

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more thoughtful.

5. Set the delivery date if you want the gift card to arrive on a specific day. This is great for birthdays or holidays when you want the surprise to hit at just the right moment.
6. Complete the purchase. The recipient will receive an email with a code they can redeem in their Steam Wallet.

The beauty of a Steam Gift Card is that it works regardless of friendship duration and regional restrictions. The recipient can then use the wallet credit to buy any game they like, including those on sale during seasonal events.

Method 3: Gifting from Your Steam Inventory

If you already own a game and have an extra copy sitting in your Steam inventory (for example, from a bundle or a duplicate purchase), you can gift that copy directly. This is another way to answer **how to gift games on Steam** without spending additional money.

Steps to Gift from Inventory

- Open your **Steam Inventory**

by clicking on your profile name and selecting “Inventory” from the dropdown.

- Find the game you wish to gift. It will appear as a “Gift Copy” item.
- Click on the game item and then select “**Send Gift**”.
- Choose a recipient from your friends list or enter their email address.
- Add a message if desired, and confirm the gift.

Note that not all games from bundles are tradeable or giftable. Steam’s terms vary, so check the item description before attempting

to send it.

Understanding Steam’s Gifting Rules and Limitations

To ensure a smooth experience when learning **how to gift games on Steam**, it’s important to understand certain rules that Steam has in place to prevent fraud and unauthorized gifting.

Friendship Duration

As mentioned earlier, you must

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have been friends with the recipient for at least three days. This rule applies to direct game gifting but does *not* apply to Steam Gift Cards. If you need to send a game immediately to someone new, either use a gift card or wait three days after adding them as a friend.

Regional Pricing and Currency Differences

Steam uses regional pricing to make games more affordable in different parts of the world. If you try to gift a game to someone in a different region, Steam may block the transaction or display a

warning. In many cases, the game can still be gifted if the price difference is less than 10%. However, for larger gaps, the gift will not be allowed. Gift cards, on the other hand, are region-locked – the recipient must have a Steam account registered in the same region as the card's currency.

Refunds for Gifts

If the recipient has not accepted the gift, the sender can cancel the gift and receive a refund. Once the gift is accepted, Steam's standard refund policy applies: the recipient can request a refund (if they have played less than two hours and

owned the game for less than 14 days), but the refund goes back to the original purchaser.

Tips for a Successful Steam Gift

Knowing **how to gift games on Steam** is one thing, but doing it in a way that feels personal and thoughtful can make all the difference.

- **Ask about their wishlist.** Many Steam users maintain a public wishlist. Checking it ensures you buy a game they actually want.
- **Wait for a sale.** Steam holds

major seasonal sales (Summer, Winter, Halloween, etc.). Gifting during these periods can save you a lot of money.

- **Write a genuine message.** Even a simple “Happy Birthday, hope you enjoy this!” adds a human touch.
- **Consider a bundle.** Sometimes you can purchase a bundle that includes multiple games, then gift the extras to friends.
- **Use the “Schedule Delivery” feature.** This is perfect for coordinated surprises or if you want the gift to arrive exactly on a

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special date.

Troubleshooting Common Gifting Issues

Even with clear instructions on **how to gift games on Steam**, problems can occasionally arise. Here are fixes for the most common issues.

“You cannot gift this game to this friend”

This usually happens because of regional restrictions or insufficient friendship time. First, check that

you have been friends for at least three days. If you have, the issue is likely regional. Try switching to a gift card instead, or ask the recipient to create a Steam account in the same region as yours.

“The gift was not received”

If the recipient didn’t receive an email, ask them to check their spam folder. Also, confirm that the email address you entered is correct. If you sent it to a Steam friend, they can find the gift under their “Inventory” — specifically the “Gift Inventory” tab. They should also check the “View Pending

Gifts" section in their account settings.

"The recipient cannot redeem the gift"

If the recipient already owns the game, they will be prompted to accept the gift anyway (it will be added to their inventory for later trading or gifting). Alternatively, they can decline the gift so you receive a refund. If the game is unavailable in their region, the redemption will fail and the gift will be returned to your inventory after 30 days.

Non-Friends: Is It Possible?

While the most common method of gifting on Steam is through the friends list, you can also send gifts via email. This is especially useful when you want to surprise someone who is not yet on your friends list. However, as mentioned, the recipient must redeem the gift within 30 days, and the email method still subjects you to regional restrictions. For recipients without a Steam account, a gift card sent via email

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is the best route because they can create an account and redeem the credit at their leisure.

Learning **how to gift games on Steam** opens up a wonderful way to share your love of gaming with others. Whether you buy a specific title, send a flexible gift card, or
