Using your crochet hook, go underneath the top bands and hook the bottom twisted band on the left peg. Pull it up and over the peg, releasing it into the center. Repeat this on the right peg. The twisted band is now looped over the straight bands.

Step 5: Continue the Chain

Add another straight band to the pegs. You will now have three bands again: the two from the previous step plus the new one. Hook the bottom band on the left peg, pull it up and over, then repeat on the right peg. Continue this process of adding one band and hooking the bottom band over until your bracelet reaches the desired length.

Step 6: Finish the Bracelet

When your chain is long enough, you will have two bands remaining on the pegs. Take the bottom band on the left peg and loop it over the top band, then repeat on the right. You should now have one loop on each peg. Take one loop, pull it over the other peg, so both loops are on the same peg. Finally, take a C-clip and hook it through both loops. Carefully remove the bracelet from the peg and clip the other end of the C-clip into the starting loop (the figure eight end).

Once your fishtail bracelet is the right length, you will have two bands left on the pegs. Take the bottom band on the left peg and loop it over the remaining band, then do the same on the right. You now have one loop on each peg. Transfer one loop to the other peg, hooking both with a C-clip. Remove the bracelet from the peg and attach the other side of the C-clip to the initial figure eight loop.
