We will cover everything from core mechanics and resource management to advanced combat tactics and boss fight strategies, ensuring you are prepared for the horrors that await.

Survival

The opening moments of your playthrough set the tone for the entire experience. You wake up in Jill's apartment with a limited inventory and a city that is already collapsing. Before you even step out the door, there are critical choices to make regarding difficulty and your initial approach to the game. This **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** recommends that newcomers select "Standard" difficulty. While "Assisted" mode offers auto-healing and easier aiming, it can create bad habits. Standard mode provides a balanced challenge that teaches you the importance of every action.

Understanding the Three Core Resources

Your survival hinges on the management of three key resources: **Health**, **Ammunition**, and **Inventory Space**. Unlike a traditional first-person shooter, you cannot afford to go in guns blazing. Every time you take damage, you are depleting a finite resource: green herbs and first aid sprays. Every missed shot is a bullet you will not have for the next zombie. And every item you carry is a slot you cannot use for a key item or a grenade. The golden rule of this **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** is simple: **only take fights you can win efficiently, and run from the ones you cannot.**

The Art of Movement: The Dodge Mechanic

The single most important skill to master in Resident Evil 3 is the **dodge**. This is not just a cosmetic evasion; it is a tactical tool that can literally mean the difference between life and death. The dodge allows you to quickly sidestep or backflip away from enemy attacks, creating a window for counter-attacks.

- **Timing is Everything:** The dodge is not invincible at all frames. You must time it so that you press the button just as the enemy is about to land a hit. Practice this against the first few zombies outside your apartment. Mastering the "perfect dodge" (activating the dodge at the last possible moment) triggers a slow-motion effect, allowing you to line up a critical headshot or quickly reposition yourself.
- **Direction Matters:** Dodging toward an enemy is often safer than dodging backward, as it can put you behind their attack hitbox. Dodging to the side is your safest bet for avoiding lunging attacks from creatures like the Hunter.
- **When NOT to Dodge:** Dodging consumes stamina and can leave you vulnerable if you mistime it. In tight corridors, it is often better to stand your ground with a shotgun blast or a flash grenade than to risk a failed dodge that lands you in a corner.

Weaponry and Upgrades: Choosing Your Tools of Destruction

Raccoon City is littered with weapon pickups, but not all firearms are

created equal. Your strategy should evolve as you acquire new tools. This section of the **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** will help you prioritize which weapons to upgrade and how to use them effectively.

The Handgun: Your Silent Partner

Jill's starting G19 handgun is deceptively weak, but it becomes a powerhouse once you find the **Tactical Stock** and **Red Dot Sight**. Prioritize headshots with the handgun to conserve precious shotgun shells and grenade rounds. A single headshot will not kill a standard zombie, but it will stun them for several seconds, allowing you to run past. The fully upgraded handgun (the "Samurai Edge") offers high critical hit rates, making it a viable weapon for the entire game, even against tougher foes.

The Shotgun: The Crowd Controller

When you find the shotgun in the Kendo Gun Shop, your survival odds increase significantly. The shotgun excels at close range, dealing massive damage to multiple enemies at once. It is your go-to weapon for dealing with zombie groups and stunning larger enemies like Hunters. However, it is loud and attracts attention. Use the shotgun sparingly; save it for emergency situations or when you are cornered. The **Shotgun Shells** are one of the most valuable resources in the game.

The Grenade Launcher: The Heavy Hitter

Found in the Downtown area, the grenade launcher is your key to dealing with the Nemesis and other major threats. It uses several ammo types, including explosive, flame, and acid rounds. **Explosive rounds** are your best bet for staggering Nemesis and dealing area damage. **Flame rounds** are excellent against the plant-like Drain

Deimos and can stun-lock hunters. **Acid rounds** offer high damage over time but are less versatile. Always try to carry at least two types of rounds for different scenarios.

Enemy Encounters: Combat Strategies for Every Foe

Understanding your enemies is half the battle. This **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** breaks down the most common threats and how to handle them efficiently.

Standard Zombies: The Undead Horde

Zombies are slow but relentless. A single bite can take a chunk of your health, and they often come in groups. **Strategy:** Aim for the knees. A shot to the leg will cripple a zombie, causing it to crawl. Crawling zombies are far less threatening than standing ones and can be easily avoided. If you must kill them, a headshot with a handgun or a single shotgun blast to the torso will do the trick. Remember, **killing is not always required**. Running past a zombie is often the smarter resource management choice.

Hunters: The Agile Predators

Hunters are fast, aggressive, and can leap across large gaps to close distance. They have a devastating claw swipe that can kill you in two hits on higher difficulties. **Strategy:** The Hunter is the perfect enemy to practice your dodge against. Lure them into a pounce, dodge at the last second, and then unload a shotgun blast into their chest. A single well-placed shotgun blast can stun them. Grenade rounds are also highly effective. Never fight a Hunter in a narrow hallway if you can help it; retreat to open ground where you can maneuver.

The Nemesis: The Tyrant of Raccoon City

The Nemesis is the star of the show. He is fast, relentless, and armed with a variety of weapons. He appears throughout the game in scripted encounters and chases. **Strategy:** You do not have to kill the Nemesis in every encounter. Your primary goal is usually to escape the area or complete an objective. In his standard form, use the grenade launcher with explosive rounds to stagger him, then run. When he arms his flamethrower or rocket launcher, keep your distance and use the environment to break his line of sight. The best strategy is to **avoid direct confrontation** unless you are forced into a boss arena. When you do fight him, aim for the chest (his weak point) to trigger a stagger, then unload everything you have.

Item Management: The Tetris of Survival

Your inventory is a constant source of tension. You will always feel like you do not have enough space. This **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** recommends a strict inventory hierarchy.

1. **Weapons:** Carry one handgun and one heavy weapon (shotgun or grenade launcher). A third weapon is often overkill and eats space.
2. **Ammunition:** Stack ammo vertically when possible. Carry no more than two stacks of handgun ammo and one stack of shotgun/grenade launcher ammo.
3. **Healing:** Always carry one green herb or a mixed herb. First Aid Sprays are precious; save them for emergencies.
4. **Utility:** Flash grenades (for stunning enemy groups and Nemesis) and a single lockpick or bolt cutter (if you are in an area with many locked items).
5. **Key Items:** These cannot be discarded. Plan your route so you

are not backtracking endlessly.

Use the **Item Box** at every safe room. Do not hoard resources. If you have three handgun magazines, combine them into a higher stack. If you find a weapon upgrade, equip it immediately. The key to success is **adaptability**. If you see a dangerous room ahead, switch your loadout to prepare for close-quarters combat.

Advanced Tips: For the Completionist

Exploration and Puzzle Solving: Efficiency is Key

Resident Evil 3 is more linear than its predecessor, but it still rewards thorough exploration. Every room, alley, and shop in Raccoon City contains either resources, lore, or progress items. Use your map frequently. A red door signifies that it is locked or inaccessible for now. A blue door means you have been there. **Check your map for blue markers.** These indicate puzzles or locked doors that you have interacted with.

Puzzles in this game are generally straightforward, involving fuse boxes, circuit boards, and code pads. If you get stuck, look around the room for a document or a hint. For the train puzzle (the battery connection), write down the number of connections on the whiteboard. For the hospital safe, the code is hidden in the director's

office. Patience and observation will solve 99% of the puzzles. This **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** advises against using guides for puzzles unless you have been stuck for more than 10 minutes; the satisfaction of figuring them out on your own is part of the experience.

Once you have beaten the game once, you will unlock additional content and higher difficulties. Here are some advanced strategies from this **Resident Evil 3 Strategy Guide** to help you master the game.

Inferno Difficulty: The True Test

Inferno mode is brutally difficult. Enemies are faster, hit harder, and have more health. The Nemesis will one-shot you with his charge attack if you are not at full health. To survive Inferno, you must master the perfect dodge. Practice it on standard difficulty until it is muscle memory. Additionally, prioritize the **Assault Coin** and **Recovery Coin** from the shop (if you have the DLC or points). These items provide passive damage and defense boosts, turning the tide in impossible fights. Use
