Best Seeds for Strongholds and End Portals

Finding the End Portal is one of the toughest challenges in survival Minecraft. Strongholds are buried deep underground and can take hours to locate even with Eye of Ender. Using cheat seeds, you can spawn near a stronghold or even have the End Portal room

exposed. Here are two must-try seeds:

Seed: “THESTRONGHOLD” - Portal Under Spawn

As the name suggests, this seed generates a stronghold directly below the spawn point. Dig down at coordinates x=0, z=0, and you will find the portal room about 40 blocks deep. The portal frames are already filled with 9 ender pearls in the chests nearby. You only need to light the portal with flint and steel to enter The End. This seed is perfect for speedrunners.

Seed: “EMERALD” - Dual Strongholds with End Cities

Seed “EMERALD” not only gives you a stronghold within 200 blocks of spawn but also spawns a second stronghold near a village. The End dimension generated by this seed has an End City with an Elytra and shulker boxes on the outer islands. This makes it an excellent seed for players who want to beat the Ender Dragon and then explore the outer End without exhausting travel.

Seeds for Rare Biomes and Structures

Minecraft Pocket Edition features several rare biomes like the Ice Spikes, Mushroom Island, and the Badlands. Finding them naturally can be a lengthy trek. Use these cheat seeds to guarantee you start in or near these biomes:

- **Seed “MUSHROOM”:** Spawns on a mushroom island biome where no hostile mobs spawn. Ideal for a peaceful survival start with unlimited mooshroom stew.
- **Seed “MESA”:** Places you on the edge of a badlands biome (mesa) with exposed orange, red, and white terracotta layers. Great for building colorful bases or collecting gold.
