If you are reading from a guitar transcription, pay attention to the hybrid picking sections where Eddie plucks individual notes within chords.

For Vocalists

The vocal melody spans a moderate range, from a low A to a high E. The sheet music will include the melody line with lyrics. Focus on breath control during the long phrases in the chorus, and do not be afraid to add your own emotional interpretation. Sammy Hagar’s delivery is conversational in the verses and more belted in the choruses—this dynamic is marked in the score’s dynamics and phrasing.
