This area is accessed through the main Saarthal excavation site, often triggered during the "Under Saarthal" quest.

Locating the Correct Chamber

After completing the initial College quests in Saarthal, return to the central chamber where Tolfdir is examining the artifacts. From there, proceed through the previously locked doors deeper into the ruin. You will eventually come across a room with a large stone puzzle door and a nearby pedestal. Unlike Folgunthur, the claw required for this door is not found inside the dungeon itself. Instead, you must have the Diamond Claw in your inventory.

Obtaining the Diamond Claw

The Diamond Claw is typically looted from a dead mage named Jyrik Gauldurson, who is encountered during the "Under Saarthal" quest. If you have already completed that quest, you should have the claw in your inventory. If you sold it, you can retrieve it from the merchant you sold it to, or use a console command on PC. The pattern on the Diamond Claw is the key to the puzzle.

The Puzzle Door Sequence

Once you have the Diamond Claw, approach the puzzle door in Saarthal. Examine the claw closely in your inventory menu to see the correct order. The solution for this door is:

- **Top Ring:** Whale
- **Middle Ring:** Snake

- **Bottom Ring:** Whale

Rotate the rings to match this pattern. The whale symbol is the one resembling a large fish, while the snake symbol is a coiled serpent. After aligning the rings, use the Diamond Claw to unlock the door. - **Top Ring:** Wolf
- **Middle Ring:** Moth

Defeating Sigdis Gauldurson

Sigdis is a particularly annoying boss because he creates multiple copies of himself. The real Sigdis glows with a faint magical aura. Focus your attacks on the glowing figure while using cover to avoid the volleys of arrows from the copies. Once he is defeated, you can claim the final amulet fragment.

Reassembling the Gauldur Amulet

After collecting all three fragments from Folgunthur, Saarthal, and Geirmund's Hall, you must combine them. To do this, you must return to the Gauldur Cave, which is located near the exit of Folgunthur. Inside the cave, you will find a tomb. Place all three fragments onto the pedestal. The spirit of Archmage Gauldur will appear, thank you for freeing him from his cursed existence, and bless you with the fully restored Gauldur Amulet.

Why the Gauldur Amulet is Worth It

The completed Gauldur Amulet is one of the best necklaces in the base game. It grants a generous boost to Magicka, Health, and Stamina. This makes it incredibly valuable for hybrid characters who rely on both combat and magic. Completing this quest is a rite of passage for many Skyrim players, and understanding the Skyrim Forbidden Legend puzzle solution is essential for earning this reward.

Common Mistakes and Troubleshooting Tips
