- **Master Ball (x999):** 82025840 0001
- **Rare Candy (x999):** 82025840 0044
- **Max Revive (x999):** 82025840 0048
- **Full Restore (x999):** 82025840 003D

Note: After using these codes, you may need to deposit or discard the first item to access other items in your Bag. It is recommended to use these cheats only when needed, then disable them to avoid menu glitches.

Infinite Money (PokéDollars)

Running out of cash to buy Poké Balls or Potions is a thing of the past. This cheat sets your money to the maximum value (999,999 PokéDollars). Activate it, talk to a PokéMart clerk, and your funds will be maxed out.

Code: 820257BC 423F (then change to 820257BE 000F — both need to be entered as separate cheats in John GBA, or combine as one multi-line cheat).

Wild Pokémon Modifier - Encounter Any Pokémon

Want to catch Mewtwo at the start or find a wild Charizard? The wild

Pokémon modifier allows you to set the next wild encounter to any species. The code format requires two lines: one to enable the modifier, and one to set the species number.

- **Enable Wild Modify:** 83007CFA 0001
- **Pokémon Species (example: Mewtwo - 150):** 83007CFC 0096 (replace 0096 with the hex value of the desired Pokémon)

Popular hex values include: Bulbasaur 0001, Charmander 0004, Squirtle 0007, Pikachu 0019, Mew 0097. A full list is widely available online. After enabling both cheats, step into tall grass to encounter the chosen Pokémon.

Unlimited Master Balls (Alternative)

If you prefer to have infinite Master Balls in your Bag without filling slot 1, use this code that constantly restocks your Master Ball count to 99 when you check your item inventory.

Code: 82005274 0063

Walk Through Walls

This classic cheat allows you to bypass obstacles and explore areas normally inaccessible. It is perfect for speedruns or reaching hidden locations.

Code: 7881B4B5 8DFF0B7A (Action Replay format - in John GBA, choose Action Replay code type).

Pro tip: Disable this cheat after crossing a wall to prevent getting stuck or falling through the map boundaries.
