If the water level does not drop sufficiently within a set period—typically around eight minutes—the machine pauses the cycle and displays the error. This is a safety feature designed to prevent the motor from overheating or damaging the pump. The **Maytag 3000 Series Washer F 21** code can appear at the beginning of a cycle, after a wash, or during the final spin, and it usually halts operation until the issue is resolved.

- **Control Board Malfunction:** Rarely, the electronic control board misreads the water level or timing, triggering a false error.

Diagnosing the F21 Error: Step-by-Step Troubleshooting

Before you begin, unplug the washer from the electrical outlet for safety. Also, have a bucket, towels, and a flashlight handy. Follow these steps in order, as they progress from simplest and most common fixes to more complex ones.

Step 1: Check the Drain Hose and Standpipe

Start with the easiest potential issue. Examine the drain hose that runs from the back of the washer to the drain pipe or utility sink.

- Ensure the hose is not kinked or tightly bent. Straighten any twists.
- If the hose is connected to a standpipe, make sure the pipe is not clogged. Pour a bucket of water down the standpipe; if it drains slowly, the house plumbing may be blocked.
- The drain hose should be inserted no more than 4 to 8 inches into the standpipe. If it is too deep, it can cause siphoning and drainage problems.
- Check that the standpipe height is between 30 and 96 inches (most codes require 36–42 inches). If it is too high, the pump cannot overcome the vertical lift.

Step 2: Clean the Drain Pump Filter

On many **Maytag 3000 Series Washer** models, the drain pump filter is located behind a small access panel at the front bottom of the machine. This is a common area for debris to collect.

1. Unplug the washer.
2. Open the access panel (usually a small door or a removable lower kickplate).
3. Place a shallow pan or towels under the filter area to catch water.
4. Slowly twist the filter knob counterclockwise to release it (some models have a cap that pulls out). Be prepared for water to spill.
5. Remove the filter and clean it thoroughly under running water. Remove any lint, coins, hair, or small objects.
6. Check the cavity behind the filter for obstructions.
7. Reinstall the filter, ensuring it is tight but not over-tightened. Close the access panel.

Step 3: Inspect the Drain Pump and Impeller

If the filter is clean and the hose is fine, the pump itself may be the problem.

- With the power off, disconnect the drain hose from the pump outlet and check for blockages inside the pump housing.
- You can often access the pump by removing the bottom panel or tilting the washer carefully. Refer to your user manual for exact locations.
- Look for foreign objects like socks or bra wires that could prevent the impeller from spinning.
- If the pump motor is humming but not pumping, the impeller may be broken. In that case, the pump assembly will need replacement.

Step 4: Check the Pressure Switch and Wiring

The pressure switch (also called a water level sensor) tells the control board when the drum is empty. A faulty switch can cause the F21 error.

1. Locate the pressure switch: usually a round plastic component on the upper side of the washer, connected to a small tube that runs down to the tub.
2. Check that the tube is not clogged, kinked, or disconnected. If the tube is blocked, the switch may not detect the correct water level.
3. Inspect the wiring harness connecting the switch to the control board. Look for loose connectors, burnt wires, or corrosion.

Step 5: Reset the Washer and Test

After performing the above checks, plug the washer back in and try a simple drain/spin cycle to see if the error clears. Sometimes a temporary glitch can cause the F21 code, and a reset helps. To reset a **Maytag 3000 Series Washer**, unplug it for one minute, then plug it back in. If the error persists after resetting, the problem is likely mechanical or electrical.

Preventing the Maytag 3000 Series Washer F 21 Error in the Future

- **Clean the drain pump filter regularly:** Check and clean the filter every three to six months, depending on usage. This is the #1 preventive measure.
- **Empty pockets before washing:** Coins, pens, and small items often end up in the pump filter. Use mesh laundry bags for delicate items.
- **Use the correct detergent:** High-efficiency (HE) detergent is essential. Excess suds can create drainage issues.
- **Avoid overloading the washer:** Overloading strains the pump and can cause poor drainage.
- **Run a cleaning cycle monthly:** Use a washing machine cleaner or a hot water cycle with vinegar to break down residues in the drain system.
- **Inspect the drain hose periodically:** Ensure the hose is not kinked, and the connection at the standpipe remains free of lint buildup.

Understanding the Maytag 3000 Series Washer Models

The Maytag 3000 Series includes both front-load and top-load models. While the F21 error code has the same meaning across the series, the location of components like the pump filter varies. Always consult your specific model's manual. Common models in this series include the **MVW6230HW**, **MVW6200KW**, and similar. The troubleshooting steps above are generally applicable to all, but note that top-load models may have the filter behind a lower front panel or inside the drum. For front-loaders, the filter is almost always behind the small bottom access door.

Is the F21 Error Covered Under Warranty?

If your **Maytag 3000 Series Washer** is still under the original manufacturer's warranty (typically one year for parts and labor), the F21 error caused by defects in materials or workmanship should be covered. However, blockages due to user error—such as leaving items in pockets or failing to clean the filter—are usually not covered. Check your warranty terms or contact Maytag support.
